

## Studio Museum In Harlem

A delegation of ten associates attended The Studio Museum In Harlem's 2005 Contemporary Friends Spring Benefit on May 12. The event, co-sponsored by Hughes Hubbard, benefits the Museum in its mission to "focus on the work of artists of African descent, locally, nationally and globally."

Founded in 1968, The Studio Museum In Harlem has supported some 90 artists-in-residence, many of whom have gone on to highly regarded careers in the arts. Its permanent collection consists of more than 1600 paintings and is home to the archives of James VanDerSee (1906-83), whose photographs chronicled the life of Harlem for generations.
