## RESOURCE ALERT: FROM CAR WASH TO FOX HUNT -- A STRANGE BREW

In honor of late Cream bass guitarist Jack Bruce, in the Alert Abikoff notes that companies and individuals must be more alert and vigilant than ever given the current “Strange Brew” of global anti-corruption enforcement activities and multinational due diligence and internal investigations (“She’s some kind of demon messing in the glue / If you don’t watch out it’ll stick to you (to you.) / What kind of fool are you? / Strange brew, kill what’s inside of you.”).

Hughes Hubbard’s Winter 2015 FCPA/Anti-Bribery Alert begins with a summary and analysis of certain critical enforcement trends and lessons from recent global enforcement activity.

The Alert provides a detailed focus on enforcement and legislative efforts in Brazil, China, the European Union, and Norway. It also contains descriptions of recent settlements and criminal matters, and a summary of each DOJ Review and Opinion Procedure Release issued since the FCPA’s enactment in 1977.
